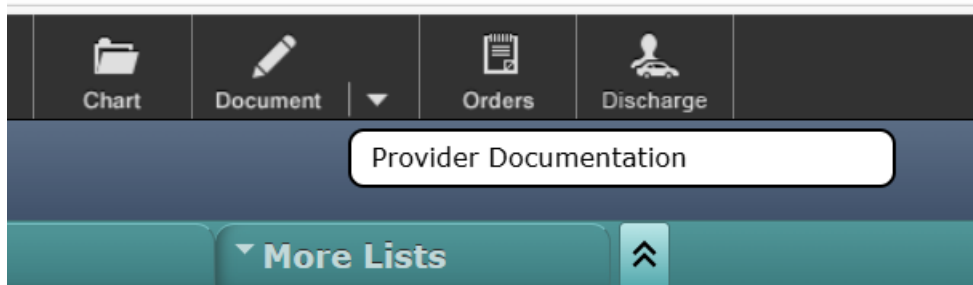


Use of the surgical tracker

Surgical and anaesthetic users – we have removed all items under the Documentation drop-down in the surgical tracker apart from Provider Documentation as use of the other items was causing an inability for the theatre teams to complete their documentation.



Surgical documentation:

This can be accessed in two ways:

1. Provider Documentation in the surgical tracker as per the screenshot above.
2. By opening the patient in the Acute Status board – using the Surgical Cases view as per the screenshot below. If you have opened the patient's chart in the surgical tracker you need to close this before accessing the acute status board.

Anaesthetic prescribing:

This cannot be accessed by using the Orders button in the surgical tracker as per the screenshot above – the workflow is to access ordering through the Acute Status Board and then the Surgical Cases view.

If you have opened the patient's chart in the surgical tracker you need to close this before accessing the acute status board.

There is no need for anaesthetists to enter drugs onto the MAR or record as administered but if you wish to view the MAR you need to open the patient from the Acute Status board as per the screenshot below.

Accessing the surgical cases view on the Acute Status Board

1. Click on rounds patients
2. Click on surgical cases in either the recent lists or the menu to the right.
